A paper can be accepted as RRP, RRR, SRP, or POS:

RRP: Regular Research Paper -papers will be a maximum of 7 pages in Camera-Ready form (will be published in the proceedings). RRP papers will be presented in FORMAL Sessions. Each presentation will be 20 minutes long.

RRR: Regular Research Report - papers will be a maximum of 7 pages in Camera-Ready form (will be published in the proceedings). RRR and RRP papers will be considered to be in the same category in the proceedings (absolutely no difference between RRP and RRR papers in the proceedings). RRR papers will be presented in DISCUSSION Sessions. Authors of these papers are expected to bring with them to the conference a maximum of 10 pages describing their paper. These pages will be pinned to presentation boards during the DISCUSSION Sessions (fonts should be large enough so that the paper can be viewed/read from about 1.5 meters distance.) Any reasonable typesetting format is acceptable. Authors of RRR papers are expected to be present during these sessions to answer any questions that readers might have. Note that authors of RRR papers are still required to send the Camera-Ready of their papers by the announced due date for publication in the proceedings.

SRP: Short Research Paper: papers will be a maximum of 4 pages in Camera-Ready form (will be published in the proceedings). SRP papers will be presented in DISCUSSION Sessions. Authors of these papers are expected to bring with them to the conference a maximum of 10 pages describing their paper. These pages will be pinned to presentation boards during the DISCUSSION Sessions (fonts should be large enough so that the paper can be viewed/read from about 1.5 meters distance.) Any reasonable typesetting format is acceptable. Authors of SRP papers are expected to be present during these sessions to answer any questions that readers might have. Note that authors of SRP papers are still required to send the Camera-Ready of their papers by the announced due date for publication in the proceedings.

POS: Poster Papers - papers WILL NOT be included in the conference proceedings for publication. POS papers describe research projects that are at early stages of their design. POS papers will be presented in DISCUSSION Sessions. Authors of these papers are expected to bring with them to the conference a maximum of 10 pages describing their paper. These pages will be pinned to presentation boards during the DISCUSSION Sessions (fonts should be large enough so that the paper can be viewed/read from about 1.5 meters distance.) Any reasonable typesetting format is acceptable. Authors of POS papers are expected to be present during these sessions to answer any questions that readers might have.
